TECHNOLOGY NEWS

WITH THE NEW YEAR COMES A NEW CATALOG

Coming in the near future: **Evergreen**, your **new catalog**. This catalog combines the Western and Central Regions—no more searching in two catalogs—all central and western region materials will be in one catalog, making it more accessible and easier to use for you!

Using your **Patron Login** will be a breeze with the dashboard offering your Account Summary, Items Checked Out, Holds, Preferences and Lists. **Lists** in the new catalog will be better or-

ganized and shareable. Recommendations can be broadcast via **RSS** and comments can be made in real time.

What do you need to know?

○ During the change-over, you will not have access to your C/WMARS Patron Account for up to 9 days.

○ When you first login to the new catalog, your old password won't work. Your temporary password is the last four digits of your barcode. You'll be required to change it upon first login.

○ Your current **reading history** and **wishlists** will not be carried over in the migration. If you want to keep these lists, be sure to export them prior to January 30.

○ **Online payment** of library fees & fines will not be possible in the new catalog until further notice.

directions. You could also try the Guided Tour or use the extensive Help & FAQ pages to gain your footing. Still lost? Ask a librarian!

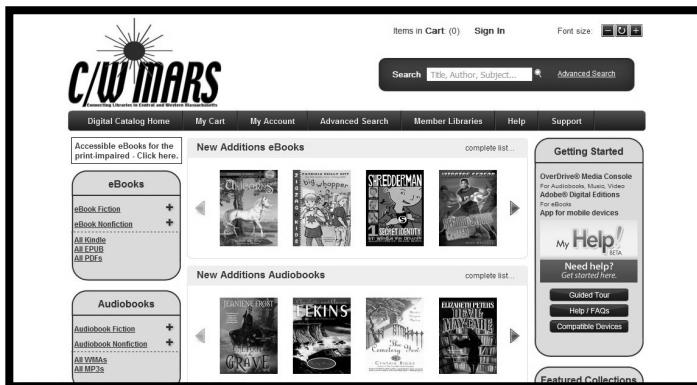

LSTA GRANT PERKS UP YOUNG ADULT BOOKS & EVENTS

Lilly Library received a \$15,000 two-year Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Grant from The Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners to expand its collection and services for 'tweens and Teens.

In preparation for this grant, Young Adult Librarian, Kathy Jalowiec, formed the Young Adult Council (YAC) in FY2011. YAC meets monthly; meetings

may include book discussions, program planning, and recommendations for materials selections for the YA area. YAC will be actively involved in the implementation of the LSTA 'tweens and Teens Grant.

Through the LSTA grant, 'tweens and Teens will discover New Fiction & Nonfiction, comics, graphic novels, & manga, magazines, and even materials in Spanish! A new display

case, provided by the grant, will showcase artwork and announcements for 'tweens and teens! Programs will be offered that allow our 'tweens and Teens to showcase their gifts—watch for the Skits and Improv Event that is coming soon!

Come and visit our newly created Young Adult Area (on the second floor, just to the right of the Reference Desk).

A bookplate will be included in the item you chose to commemorate your loved one. You will receive a thank you letter for your gift that can also be used for tax purposes, and, if you provide the contact information, we will send an acknowledgment of your gift to your loved one.

LIBRARY MEMORIAL GIFTS—THE GIFT THAT KEEPS GIVING

When a friend or loved one passes, many seek ways to express and honor the memory of that person. Memorial Gifts to the Library are a wonderful way to commemorate a loved one who has passed.

Memorial gifts can be given in any amount. Smaller donations generally are used to support the library's collection. In those cases, a Memorial Bookplate is placed inside the material purchased.

For years, anyone reading that material will see that

it was Given in Memory Of *Your Loved One's Name*. Larger memorials may be used to support larger services in the library.

Some examples are the Becky Sullivan Memorial which provided the chair and supports the collection in the *Becky Sullivan Meditation Corner*, the Loretta Corell Memorial which provides materials and programming for the well-being of youth and teens; the Laura Kulp Memorial which has provided support for the Laura Kulp Lap Sitting Program for

our youngest patrons, and also provides support for the children's collection for that age group; and the Martine Hargreaves Memorial which provided the picnic table that is located between the library and the civic center.

These are only a few of many ways that Memorial Gifts have provided a lasting memory of the one who has passed, but also has become a gift that keeps on giving.
